



# Flodie

## Characteristics

- Cross breeding : 80F66.25 x 81F145.14
- Breeder: Bretagne Plants - Registration 1998
- Type: Ware potato, well adapted for export
- Maturity: Mid early
- Dry matter content : low - 17-18 %
- Tubers : light skin, pale yellow flesh, oval to long oval, very shallow eyes
- Very high yield, high percentage of large tubers, good tuberization
- Cooking quality : no blackening after cooking  
Very well adapted for oven cooking and gratin
- Group A - B



## Crop advices

- Use well warm up seeds, plant at the sprout growth stage
- Sensitive to desprouting, do not damage the sprouts
- Plant the seeds deep and make big ridges to avoid green tubers
- Treatment to prevent black scurf and silver scab is advised

## Adaptation

- Well adapted in many areas, from the Mediterranean countries till the north of France

### Diseases

- No sensibility known to metribuzine
- Susceptible to foliage blight
- Moderately susceptible to tuber blight
- Moderately susceptible to common scab
- Moderately susceptible to viruses
- Rather good resistance to internal defects

### Irrigation

- Make a first application early if the ridges not enough compacted
- During the growing, applications will be related to the evapotranspiration
- Elodie is fairly flexible to regular applications
- The last application has to be well controlled, Elodie is fairly susceptible to lenticels

### Desiccation - harvesting

- Fairly easy to desiccate canopy
- Skin finishing : 3 weeks, harvesting well mature
- Do not harvest in wet conditions, however Elodie does not grow deeply, which allows to start harvesting after a rain
- Not susceptible to mechanical damage



### Storage

- For a good wound healing enter dry tubers medium store keeping
